Preschool:

- **Tuesday,** we learned about ducks and chickens on the farm. We looked at "Baby Farm Animals" and read/sang a rhyme about ducks. We told what we know about ducks and chickens, compared, and contrasted them.
- We worked on identifying and matching alphabet letters, and we sorted pom poms by color using tweezers.
- We danced the freeze song and animal actions for music and movement.
- Thursday, we talked about sheep and goats. We read a book about sheep on a farm and then told what we learned. We counted goats and sheep, gluing them to the numbers 1-5. We counted children for practice.
- We listened to "I like my Hat" and "The Farmer's Hat"
- We practiced saying the ABC's and counting 1-10.
- We thanked God for our blessings.

HOMEWORK (for the year):

Parents: Teaching your child a balanced, life-long healthy lifestyle can be a year-long goal by encouraging them to spend a good portion of the day outside, where they can exercise, get fresh air, explore God's beautiful nature, and learn new skills. To promote healthy minds: drawing, coloring, cutting, writing, and reading to them (every day) are invaluable as well as limiting time in front of the TV and devices.

Prekindergarten:

- Monday, we started with Music with Ms. Varon. We worked on greeting each other by name. We moved to apple counting songs, fingerplays with directions and opposites, scarf dance, stop and go, fast and slow.
- We made leaf rubbings using fresh leaves and chalk. We talked about and read how we know it is fall.
- We talked about the letters E,e and #2
- We learned about and practiced crawling low under smoke in our Fire Safety lesson.

- Wednesday, we talked about two subjects, fire safety and pumpkins. We finished our lesson
 cards with what to do if your clothes catch on fire, (stop, drop, cover your face, roll around.) Mr.
 Blas, who is a firefighter in Seattle, came to the class with his uniform and lessons. The children
 loved it.
- We talked about the pumpkin cycle. We created a cycle plate 1-4, learning how a cycle starts all over again. We read a fire safety book and a pumpkin book.
- We practiced writing letters E,e, played "What's Missing" with "E" items, and played in the Farmer's Market.
- It was early release day.

- One of our many goals is to teach independence to your child. We ask them to attempt all self-care (wiping after toilet, putting on shoes, putting on jackets, carrying their bags, hanging up their backpacks and coats, etc.) by themselves before helping if needed.
