Calling all Student Ambassadors!

What are they? Student Ambassadors are advocates and promoters of our wonderful school. They were previously only responsible for tours at our Open Houses, and starting this year, the job has expanded to include: assemblies, theme days, Peacemaker presentations, and morning announcements. Therefore, we are looking to fill additional positions for the 2022-2023 school year.

Who can they be? Any student in Grade 6-8 for 2022-2023 can apply, but priority is given to rising 7th and 8th graders. We are looking for nine total ambassadors. Four of these will remain from our current year (Daliah, Genevieve, Uma, and Stella), but we'll be interviewing to fill five vacancies. Any rising 6th-8th grader may apply this year.

What is expected? 4-5 Ambassadors will need to attend at least two (2) of the following events throughout the school year:

1. Back to School Reception in August (day before school begins)
2. Preschool/Kindergarten Open House in November (evening event)
3. Open House in January/February (could be Sunday afternoon or an evening)

They may also need to meet at lunch recess one day per week, plan assemblies four times per year, and be available at other times for set-up or take-down of activities. This year, we are planning those different "ambassadors" will be assigned different roles based on their gifts and talents. Students may also be called out of class for 15-20 minutes in a school day to provide tours with Mr. Anderson for prospective families.

What is required? Students may be excused from class during the school day throughout the year for tours and they need to have shown solid academic performance to take on this role. They must be in good academic standing and maintain grades of nothing lower than a B- in any of their classes (per weekly progress reports) in order to apply and to be considered. Dress code: Students wear their dress uniforms to each of these events, in clean and proper order.
